What was the challenge?

Develop a visual language to communicate the aims and progress of the Indigenous-led Firesticks network for communities, partners and stakeholders including government funding agencies, land management organisations such as National Parks and Wildlife Service, NSW Rural Fire Service, educational institutions and the wider public.

What was the solution?

Committed to principles of respect, recognition and responsibility as organizing principles the Indigenous—led participatory process provide the architecture and the information for the website. The results of the consultative process are reflected in the visual language of the brandmark, the location of partner sites for the current grant; the process and values diagrams and the charcoal illustrations for use in website banners and content, videos, print and conference materials.

What was the effect?

A flexible visual language to communicate the aims and progress of the Firesticks project to a wide audience including the scientific and natural resource management community. The visual elements can be deconstructed and reused in various applications creating a sustainable platform for ongoing use across various media according to the needs of the partners and the project.




